Verizon has much better coverage but they're only offering 4G LTE up to 22 GB a month and then your speeds will be downgraded to 4G then 3G. Look at the details. One or the other may be a viable option for you. Neither requires a contract, and at least one of them allows you to turn off the service for a few months when you're not traveling.

Have you seen any Country Coaches out and about during your travels? If you do, knock on the door and say hello. Two CC's pulled into the park where I'm staying for a two week stay. Both are Allures circa 2003. They are dry camping in the overflow area (I'm in the only site big enough for CCs and still just get 30 AMP at 110 volts if I'm lucky). Anyway, I knocked on their door to say hello, and it turns out they both just bought their coaches in the last few months. Lots of CC discussion ensued as usual. I gave them a NWCC application, an FMCA magazine and a Newsletter. We may get a couple new members. If not, it was fun to visit with Country Coach owners. Moral of that story, don't be shy. Saturday dinner will be out at a nearby Chinese restaurant.

This will be a very laid-back rally with plenty of time for relaxing and watching the river roll by. We've seen kayakers and drift-boat fishermen glide past, and it's always relaxing to just sit back, relax and listen to the water rippling over the rocks. There will be plenty of free time for exploring the area, riding the nearby tram, etc.

The park has a very spacious clubhouse for our use as well as an open-air pavilion with picnic tables. They also have a soft ice cream dispenser where you can serve your own cone or dish for just \$1. We are looking forward to a great gathering of friends, new and old, and a wonderful rally.

A Car Race Watching Rally

At the November, 2017, Thanksgiving Rally in Salem, Rod Robbins, Brent Hicks & Frank Suttell approached Lee Casebeer with the idea of having a **CAR RACE VIEWING RALLY**. Well, with Lee's car racing passion, it was a no brainer to convince him that it was a great idea. The July 2018, 58th running of the **Rose Cup** sports car races in Portland would be the perfect venue! The event was planned to have 4 of the favorite local amateur racing groups along with a very popular & successful 40 year old professional series that races at 11 famous circuits all over the U.S. The **Pirelli World Challenge Championship**, has the most high tech, state of the art "street model" car marques in the series, including Porsche 911 & Cayman, Chevrolet Corvette & Camaro, Dodge Viper, BMW M6, Mercedes AMG, Honda Fit, Bentley Continental, FORD Mustang, Ferrari 458, Lamborghini Gallard, Audio A8 LMS, Aston Martin Vantage GT3, Panoz Avezzano, and Cadillac ATS, Acura NSX, Toyota GT86 & McLaren to name some of the many brands. **THE NWCC RACE RALLY** planning was put in motion.

The very first day the tickets went on sale in February, Lee purchased 6 motorhome sites at a very busy section of **Portland International Raceway's** 2 mile race circuit.

The plan included a Thursday evening pre-race overnight gathering of the attendees at **Janzten Beach RV Park** on Columbia River's Hayden Island just a mile north of the race track. Then, we'd caravan into the race track early Friday morning, so as not to miss any of the race activity.

Then, it was a 4 month wait until the 3rd weekend of July. Dana & Frank Suttell, Teresa & Rod Robbins, Marilyn & Brent Hicks, Leann & Bill England & Kris & Lee Casebeer immediately committed to attending the event. Michelle & Denny Huffman, who live close by in Ridgefield, Washington, decided to join the campers to day-views of the races. Thursday evening prior to the event, all 12 of us went to dinner at **Salty's on the Columbia**. Along with all the sumptuous meals on the menu, there were plenty of water activities on the Columbia River for our viewing entertainment.

Friday morning at 8:00 am, we were lined up and ready to caravan. On Saturday evening most of us accepted a gracious invitation from The Huffman's to come to their Ridgefield home for dinner & some relief from the summer heat. We were dry camping & generator dependent for cooling. Michelle & Denny have a beautiful setting at the edge of a forested area, where wildlife roams freely on their lush acre.

By 2:00 PM on Sunday, most had enough racing action & summer HEAT, and we moved back to **Janzten RV Park** for a dinner out where we were joined by Bev Carrick & Sybille Beck.

On Monday morning, Frank, Dana and Rod went to Portland's Swan Island to a display of a World War II PT Boat restoration. More details of that tour will be in a separate article.

All viewers came away from the event with new found knowledge of what Sports Car Racing is about. Many felt that another event of this type would be well received in the future... Time will tell.






NWCCers Charity for 2018

Army Fisher House Foundation at Joint Base Lewis & McCord (JBLM) in Tacoma WA

The Fisher House Foundation is best known for a network of comfort homes where military and veterans' families can stay at no cost while a loved one is receiving treatment.

Madigan Army Medical Center has a full spectrum of specialty and subspecialty services for adult and pediatric patients to include Developmental Pediatrics, Perinatology Fellowship, Hematology/Oncology, NICU, and Radiation Therapy.

Our mission is to provide our military members and their families a comfortable, nurturing and secure environment while they receive medical care at Madigan Army Medical Center (MAMC).

Fisher House Information: The Fisher House is located about one half mile from MAMC. The house provides seven family rooms with private bathrooms, TV/DVD, WiFi, telephone and computers. The house has a living room, dining room and kitchen; these common areas are shared by all families. The FH will provide most amenities to include toiletries, towels, linens, high chairs, booster seats, futons, "pack and plays". Families are responsible for their meals and the kitchen is well furnished with the items needed for food preparation. Each family will have some refrigerator and freezer space plus a cabinet for their food. Laundry area and detergent are provided.

Eligibility and Cost: Fisher Houses prioritizes their rooms according to the severity of the medical condition. All active duty, retired military and military family members who live at least 40 miles away from the medical center are eligible. Referral can be made in advance; however, that does not guarantee placement into the FH. There is no charge to stay at the FH and demand for our rooms is high; because of this, families should make a back-up plan and be prepared to stay in a local hotel (average \$125 a night).

The Fisher House receives a significant portion of their funding through charitable contributions. Our donations come from individuals, spouses' clubs, military organizations, and chapel designated offerings. The Fisher house operates as a Non-Appropriated Fund Instrumentality (NAFI) of the United States Army. Donations made to the Fisher House are tax deductible.
