ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES



NorthWest Country Coachers Annual Meeting via Zoom November 6, 2021. The Zoom meeting was called to order by Vice President Floyd Hensley at 2:10 p.m.

Attendance: 12 Coaches (Gable, Schleuse, Harris, Hensley, Carrick, Beck, Gorton, Serex, Apple, Payne, Allison/McHugh, Suttell)

Minutes: The minutes of the October 10, 2020, meeting were approved as read.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Sibylle Beck reported that our membership is 49 coaches, down from 55 last year. The checkbook balance is \$5,648.57, with the only expenses for the year being \$532.89 for our website. There were no rally expenses, and there is \$219 in deposits for future rallies. We normally pay \$400 to the FMCA National Director to cover travel expenses, but Barb Schleuse declined payment this year. The Treasurer's Report was approved as presented.

FMCA National Director: Don Schleuse reported that FMCA dues have been reduced to \$50. There is a new National Treasurer who seems to be very conscientious and efficient. The new President and Board are working together much better, and membership is on the positive side. Don's terms will expire after the August 2022 rally. Upcoming rallies are: March 20-26, 2022, Tucson, Arizona August 24-27, 2022, Lincoln, Nebraska June 22-26, 2022, Coos Bay, Oregon

New Business: Richard Beck moved to eliminate dues for one year to all members of record on November 6, 2021. Following discussion, the motion was carried.

Elections: The following slate of officers were unanimously elected for 2-year terms: President Joyce Hensley Vice President Floyd Hensley Treasurer Sibylle Beck

Upcoming Rallies: March 10-13, 2022, Florence, Oregon Dana will contact the Oddfellows RV Park to see what their restrictions are for this rally. Suggestions were made for places to hold future rallies. Bev Carrick will contact Lewis & Clark RV Park in Astoria and try to set up a rally for August 2022. Floyd will arrange for a rally at Casey's in Westfir for May 2022. Other suggestions were made for possible rally sites, but members would need to volunteer to host. Some suggestions were: Blue Ox RV Park, Albany; Midway RV Park, Centralia; Osprey Point; Lakeside; Emigrant Lake, Ashland; Seven Feathers RV Park, Canyonville; Bay Point Landing, Coos Bay. Terry Apple said she is willing to host if a rally if it is held near her home. Otherwise, she will be happy to help with registrations, computer work, or whatever else she can do remotely. The meeting was adjourned at 3:30 p.m.

NEWS from November floods in Neskowin, Oregon

U.S. Coast Guard crews helped rescue 20 people and three dogs Friday trapped by floodwaters in the Neskowin Creek RV Resort just off Highway 101 in Tillamook County, Oregon. High water blocked the one road in and out of the park. By 2 p.m., the Coast Guard said its crews rescued 12 people and three dogs, some by helicopter. Other agencies assisted an-

other eight people. Officials say a mudslide remains a threat.

A Journey with Surprises

As the summer was coming to a close, our anticipation grew. This Fall's road-trip to Indianapolis Motor Speedway was eagerly planned and we were ready to begin. The first leg would be a 7-day, 2,130-mile trip to the venue. The plan included friends & family visits along the way with my partner, Karen. Then 7 nights of dry camping at the race-track & a 7 night return. The 600 watts of solar panels & sunny days would provide power to operate the residential refrigerator. Still running the "Genset" an hour morning & night would be required to maintain the deep-cycle house batteries adequately charged.

This was the second time in 3 years that the **S**ports **C**ar **C**lub of **A**merica held their weeklong championship races on the two and a half mile Indy road-course. Over 900 competitors from all over the U.S. would be competing for 26 national amateur road racing championships. The cars ranged from strictly regulated street cars with safety items; roll cages, fire suits, arm & neck restrains, & helmets, to fully configured racing machines.


In 40+ years of being a **SCCA** member, this would be Lee's 10th year of attending this annual event since his 2005 retirement. In Lee's opinion, he has the best view of the races as a Flagging & Communicator **(F&C)** volunteer at one of the many flag stations situated around a twisty road racecourse. On a road course configuration, the command/control center cannot see the entire course. The **F&C** people keep the command center informed of what is happening during the race. If there is a need for emergency vehicles the **F&C** people can request assistance. At the same time the **F&C** people communicate with drivers with a series of flags that have specific meanings.

With the coach fully stocked, we headed east. Our first **SURPRISE** was that we were not achieving the travel arrival times displayed on the GPS navigator. Lee finally realized the travel times shown on the GPS are based on travel at the legal speed limits, which, in many mid-west states, is 80 mph. Our coach's best fuel consumption is at 65 mph. So, we were being passed by everything from 80,000 lb., 18 wheelers to aging gray haired ladies in VW Beetles.

The next **SURPRISE** was the coach needed 10 oz. of engine coolant every 500 miles. Investigation discovered a leak in the Hurricane hydronic heating furnace. Repair shop wait times were many weeks out so, the furnace coolant flow got by-passed. Now the main coach heat source would be the overhead heat pumps, when plugged into shore power or running the "Genset." We also had a small oil heater to take the chill off the Midwest fall nights. Our 7 nights in Indianapolis were warm enough that no heater was needed.



After a fun filled, hectic week of race activities which involved getting up at 6:00 AM for 7:00 AM crew meeting, being on the track from 8 to 6, joining everyone for an evening "social" and then heading for bed to do it all again the next day.



The return trip started well with a relaxing night on the banks of the Mississippi River watching freight barges on the river. Then there were two nights spent at the farm of Minnesota friends for visit and to watch the corn & soybean harvesting. Another pleasant **SURPRISE** was Lee's adventure as a farmhand. After a quick orientation on farm tractor operations, the friend trusted Lee with hauling grain wagons to the nearby storage elevator.







Our next stop was a visit with an Air Force Buddy in Lincoln, Nebraska, where he and Lee enjoyed reminiscing about some of the craziest memories of their time together in Spain. The next leg of the trip moved us further west on I-80 toward Cheyenne. In dozens of past travels on I-80, a visit to Cheyenne had never happened. This time, it was fortunate that it did. Upon returning from a walk around town, **SURPRISE!** We noticed a large pool of engine coolant under the coach. We quickly located a nearby service shop and to our further **SURPRISE**, within 3 hours after our arrival the coach was in the shop getting a diagnosis.



The radiator had a pinhole in it. Another local shop qualified to do the repairs did not have an opening until late November, but there was a shop 60 miles south in Loveland, Colorado, which could further diagnosis the problem in a week. The Big question, how do we get there?? The Cheyenne shop technician suggested putting a table-spoon of Black Pepper in the coolant. We did that & went to a nearby RV park to spend the night while testing the Black Pepper theory. Sure enough, the leak had stopped. Off to Loveland we went to stay for the weeklong wait. The Loveland shop could not find the radiator leak though the tech saw signs of where it had

been leaking. The timeframe to get the radiator out & repaired was 3 to 4 weeks. So, we decided to add some more coolant to stop the leak and return to Oregon, where the coach had an appointment in Junction City to have the radiator (and many other items on the almost 200,000-mile coach) fixed. The radiator has not leaked a drop of coolant since the addition of the Cheyenne black pepper.

And here is one last parting **SURPRISE** that we discovered during the <u>previous</u> **SURPRISE**. There is a highly recognized RV repair shop in Frederick, Colorado, north of Denver. Their name is TransWest and are known for their quality motor coach repairs. But.... they do not work on coaches over 10 years old!!! So that eliminated our 2001 Intrigue. The owner of Stan's Automotive Repair in Loveland, where the second diagnosis was done, said that this age limit is becoming more prevalent in the RV repair industry. Oh, I did forget to mention that Stan's shop rate is <u>twice</u> the industry standard!! And why, you ask? **SURPRISE!!!** It is because they can!! Stan's has long wait times & many coaches sitting around needing service.
